We have also finally received the keys for our new shop in Winyates - news about an opening date will hopefully follow soon! This month we also received the amazing news that our application to the **Eveson Trust** for funding for our I&A service has been successful—we are so grateful to the Eveson Trust for their generosity and commitment to our cause!
- At our Board Meeting this month, Jonathan Shaprio was officially confirmed as the new Chair of Age UK BRWF—we look forward to this new chapter for the charity with Jonathan at the helm!

Meet the Team - Helen Cook (I&A Advisor)

- This month's meet the team features I&A Advisor Helen Cook. With two grownup children, Helen lives with her husband in Redditch, having spent most of her life in the area. After working for the NHS, spending 17 years with Redditch Borough Council (in several different Housing roles, including support for the more vulnerable residents) and a short period working as an Advisor for another local Age UK, Helen joined the Age UK BRWF team in March 2023.

- Speaking about her time at Age UK BRWF, Helen said, 'I really enjoy the I&A role and how the team operates, and the office really is a lovely place to come into. Throughout my working life I have always been 'front facing' - that contact with people is something that I really enjoy and value, as well as being able to help the older age group and being able to give them 'time'. Thinking about some of the other roles that I have had, your time is so limited...being able to offer somebody a home visit and to spend time with someone to help them to understand their options, and for them to have the confidence in the information and advice that they are receiving, is so important – that is what Age UK is renowned for and something that attracted me to the role.
- We also look at the person as a 'whole'. The initial enquiry may be for a benefit such as Attendance Allowance, but on talking with a person and visiting them at home you get much more of an insight, and are able to identify other things that might help them - this level of support, and treating everyone as an individual, is quite rare nowadays (when you often just get passed onto the next person) and makes such a big difference to people. It is also important, however, to be totally honest and frank with people – from the feedback the team receives we know that people are so very appreciative of the information, advice and the support that they receive from the I&A service'.
- When asked about demand for the service, Helen commented that, in addition to the 'traditional calls that you would expect (e.g. people looking for financial support for care needs etc) in the time that she has been with the service she has noticed an increase in calls from members of the community that have previously been 'doing okay' but who are now worried about whether their money is going to stretch 'it can be overwhelming, but people know that they can come to talk to us, that they will not be judged and that they can trust the information they receive'
- Helen added that although she is really enjoying the role, she is now at a place in her life when she is enjoying working part-time. When not involved with her family, Helen's passion is music and impressionist art – she loves live music and going to festivals and dancing saying 'singing and dancing brings you alive, it lifts your spirts and is good for your soul - I just love it!'
