## A Note from Amanda Allen (CEO of Age UK BRWF) - November 2024

- This month our Chair, Jonathan Shapiro, and I met with the MP for Redditch, Chris Bloore.
  Topics discussed included the rising cost of living, changes to the Winter Fuel Allowance and
  increasing demand for advice services, in addition to the impact of the Autumn Budget on charity
  finances. Next month we are due to meet with the MP for Bromsgrove, Bradley Thomas, whose
  Pensioners Fair we also attended this month
- Following the sale of the building in March, our **High Street Charity Shop** (Bromsgrove) closed its doors on 23rd November. Opening as a 'Pop Up' shop in January 2022, the shop has provided us with the valuable opportunity to gain experience of having a dedicated furniture shop, as well as having a High Street presence. Whilst we are sad to be closing, we are really pleased to announce that we will soon be opening a new, permanent shop on Bromsgrove High Street in the former Shoe Zone premises. This month we finally received the keys to our new shop in Kidderminster, in Walter Nash Road, so a busy time for our Retail team!

#### Meet the Team - Victoria Phillimore (Charity Shop Manager. Winyates)

- For this month's 'Meet the Team' we get to meet **Victoria Phillimore** who joined Age UK BRWF in July as Manager of our new Winyates (Redditch) Charity Shop!
- Having worked in Retail since she was 15, and with a wealth of experience,
   Victoria came to Age UK BRWF from the fashion retailer Roman, where she was
   the Acting Manager. Living in Redditch and knowing the charity's involvement with
   supporting the local community, when she saw the Winyates Shop Manager role
   being advertised, Victoria thought it would be an 'interesting position', and one
   which she would enjoy
- After almost five months, when asked how the role has met with those original expectations, Victoria said 'I think there can be a misconception about charity shops, that you just put things out on hangers and put a price on it and that's that, but when you come in and actually see behind the scenes, and what is actually done, there's a lot more hard work involved but it's rewarding hard work...when I go home at night and I'm tired it's a good tired'. When asked if there was anything that had surprised her Victoria added, 'I have been surprised at the range of items that we sell...as the saying goes, one man's trash is another man's treasure'. Victoria also added that she was surprised about the range of support and services that the charity actually provides for older people and how she now has a better understanding of how 'every penny that is raised by the shops counts' towards ensuring that this support continues.
- Since its opening in August, the Winyates shop has been really well-received and, with the support of Assistant Manager Tom, the shop already has a 'full-blown-complement' of amazing volunteers. As the shop goes through the seasons of its first year, Victoria is looking forward to trying out new ideas. Understanding the 'challenges' (!) of growing children, this month the shop has been trialling 'Lucky Bags' of Children's Clothes!
- Outside of work, married with a daughter, Victoria has two little dogs which take up a lot of her time. She also enjoys reading, going to the cinema and meals out, as well as helping the local community (including supporting the Baby Bank in Winyates)
- When asked to sum up the last few months, Victoria said, 'It has started out really good. I am
  really enjoying it, and I think that we will be here for a long while yet!'

- After 8 years, Bromsgrove Men in Sheds is starting a new chapter, with the Shedders getting ready to leave Unit 1 Metal & Ores when Age UK BRWF's lease on the property ends at the beginning of December
- With Unit 1 being put up for sale in August, the Shedders appeared on the front page of The Standard in September as they sought to find a new home. Despite a lot of support from the community, this appeal did not result in any immediate offers,



hence we were looking at the prospect of raising significant additional funds to cover the annual rent being proposed by the new owner. Just as we were looking to proceed with a new lease agreement, an opportunity arose to share a unit on **Finch End Farm** and, following a Shed Meeting on 26/10/24, the decision was taken to move - watch this space!
