TIME FOR YOU

Making a difference for carers and getting to know the cared for person too. This service puts a volunteer in place to give the carer a break knowing that they can go out and their partner or relative is in safe hands. There may be a small charge.



CARELINE

This service offers weekly phone chats to usually housebound isolated older people and is often a lifeline. Volunteers will ring the same people at roughly the same time each week on a certain day and chat about all manner of things from current affairs to pets' behaviour.

VOLUNTARY VISITING SERVICE


This service has a big heart and involves volunteers visiting an isolated older person regularly for social support and companionship. There are many people on the waiting list for the service. Volunteers are from all walks of life and the age range is impressive, from early 20s to mid 80s. New clients love the opportunity to meet someone new and hopefully their volunteer will make a difference to their lives.



There are currently 34 volunteers visiting 38 older people (some visit 2) with 4 waiting in the wings to complete their induction. Visits are weekly or fortnightly. Most visit at the older person's home though some go out for coffee, trying new establishments or sticking to their tried and tested favourite. All enjoy and value their time together, getting to know each other.







ENABLING & HOME SUPPORT SERVICE

From February, the service will be available 8:30am to 5pm, Monday and Tuesdays and 8:30am to 6pm, Wednesday to Friday.

We can offer help with cleaning, laundry, shopping, getting to appointments, de-cluttering, gardening and much more! Designed to give older people a friendly, reliable service that can offer one to one support and improve quality of life.

All our Home Support Workers are paid members of staff. They are local people who are dependable, caring and sensitive to client's needs. They are also trained in the safe use of wheelchairs.

The Forum

What is the Forum

It enables over 50s to have their voices heard by professionals, other partners, or people who they choose to come and speak. It also allows people to feel empowered and have choice. Its aim is to focus on any barriers/concerns/ challenges to ageing well in Exeter and what might be the solutions. It can be a consultative or pressure group which could influence and offer expertise or a place to discuss and share thoughts and ideas.

Who can attend

Our Over 50s Forum provides a voice for over 50s in the City of Exeter who may be accessing Age UK Exeter services but is also open to other members of the community.

Regularity

Grab your needles and wool, get set and knit! The Big Knit challenge is back again. Running since 2003 in partnership with Innocent drinks, the challenge involves knitting little hats for the tops of Innocent smoothie bottles. Every hat knitted raises 30p to help Age UK provide their much-needed services and support to older people around the country.

Knitted and crocheted by thousands of legendary volunteers, these woolly masterpieces have raised over £3 million for Age UK since 2003, with around 11 million hats knitted. Last year, the 20th anniversary of the Big Knit was marked by the creation of a 23ft tall and 20ft wide hat, made up of 545 individual blankets and 2 million yards of wool, weighing in at 817 kilogrammes!

Budding Friends is approaching it's 10-year anniversary this April, and during this time we have supported 142 people living with dementia and their carers. Some people have dipped into the project for a few months, whilst many have remained with the project for several years. and four of the volunteers have been with the group for 10 years!

We have gone from strength to strength starting with an allotment, complete with bathtub and an old engine, to a beautiful space full of vegetables and flowers. This year the group have also been working alongside Devon Wildlife Trust and the National Trust, raising native trees and shrubs which we planted out into a rewilding area on the Killerton Estate, with children from the local primary school.

EASTERN DEVON DEMENTIA PARTNERSHIP

We are leading on the new Eastern Devon Dementia Partnership, following the Eastern Devon Healthy Ageing Partnership, identifying dementia as one of their 3 key priorities.

Currently there is no clear pathway to knowing what is available across the East for people living with dementia and their carers. In undertaking this work, we aim to ensure that people have access to a more streamlined pathway with the right information at the right time.

We launch the Partnership next month with presentations from The Admiral Nurse Service, Devon Carers and The Ness Care group, to other health, social care and voluntary organisations with the vision that. going forward we will continue to share updates, information and funding opportunities.

Sycamore Days: A Safe, Fun, and Enriching Day Service for Older Adults

At Sycamore Days, we provide a welcoming and supportive environment for older adults, particularly those living with mild to moderate dementia. Our service offers a wide range of engaging activities designed to enrich the lives of our guests, giving their family/ carers a much-needed break.

What Happens at Sycamore Days?

- A range of fun, relaxing, and enriching activities, including arts and crafts, games, gentle exercise, and live music.
- Regular outings to places like National Trust properties and the Royal Albert Memorial Museum (RAMM) to engage with memory-related activities.
- Carols at Christmas: Stoke Hill Primary School visit to spread festive cheer with a carol performance.
- Therapy Dog: Our lovely therapy dog, Shadow, visits every week, bringing comfort and companionship to our guests.
- Live Music: Regular music performances create a lively and enriching atmosphere for everyone.
- In response to growing demand, we expanded our opening days to include Thursdays in 2024. This year, in 2025, we plan to introduce Mondays to offer even more flexibility for guests and their families/carers.



Why Sycamore Days Matters?

- For family/carers, Sycamore Days provides valuable respite a chance to take a break while knowing that their loved ones are in a safe and stimulating environment.

Frequently asked Questions

Q. What is Age UK Exeter's Information and Advice service?

A. A free of charge service providing information and advice on a range of topics including welfare benefit checks and subsequent applications, advice on social care, tradespeople, local services and many more general topics.

Q. What kind of advice can Age UK Exeter not advise on?

A. Age UK Exeter cannot give Legal, debt or financial advice as these are regulated; we can however signpost to agencies who can help.

Q. How is the information and advice given?

A. We can provide information and advice via the telephone, email or face to face with an arranged office appointment. We can also post out or email our AUK information guides which cover a range of topics.

Q. When is Age UK Exeter's information and Advice service open?

A. Mon – Wednesday (8am to 4pm) & Thursday (8am to Midday) – Office appointments here at the Sycamore Centre can be arranged for Monday to Wednesday

Q. How many people have accessed the information & advice service?

A. In 2024 Age UK Exeter Information & Advice service have helped over 500 clients, their families and carers.
