Why do we need your personal data?



To give you the correct services, products, help and guidance



To make sure our services are fair, equal and inclusive



To look after your health and safety



To keep you updated on our work and future plans



Who has access to your personal data?



Age UK Mid Mersey employees that are providing you with a service

Who do we share your personal data with and why?



Local groups or organisations that offer services you have asked for



Our funders, the NHS and National Age UK to help improve our services



We will share your personal data if the law says we need to for example if there is a court order or to prevent fraud or crime



We process your personal data under the Data Protection Act 2018



You have the right to ask us to stop processing your personal data



We do not:



Share your personal data for marketing purposes



Sell or rent your personal data to third parties



Share your personal data with anyone apart from legal authorities unless you have given us consent to do so

How long do we keep your personal data?



We will keep your personal data for 7 years if we have provided you with a service



We will delete your personal data from our systems sooner if you ask us to

How do we keep your personal data secure?



We make your personal data secret so only people with a special code can read it







We use security measures to keep our computer databases safe from people who aren't supposed to access them

We have rules that explain to us how to keep your personal data safe

You have the right to:





Ask for a copy of your personal data



Ask us to change your personal data



Ask us to delete or stop using your personal data
