Age UK Northamptonshire is the leading countywide provider of services for older adults. This is a position offering someone with the appropriate values and experience, the opportunity to play a pivotal role in our new bereavement service, the Bereavement Community. The role is responsible for leading the service - delivering counselling sessions, setting up and facilitating bereavement groups, supporting student counsellors and bereavement volunteers and has line management responsibility.

The role

- To establish and facilitate the Bereavement Support Programme (psycho-educational training sessions for clients)
- To set up and facilitate the Bereavement Support Groups, Drop-in groups and cafes together with other community interventions
- To organise an annual 'Lights of Reflection' service
- To facilitate informal bereavement spaces/groups
- To line-manage and work alongside the MBACP Registered Counsellors
- To line-manage the Bereavement Co-ordinator
- To recruit and support student counsellors
- To recruit and support bereavement volunteers alongside the charity's Volunteer Coordinator
- Each session will be 50 minutes in duration
- Attendance & brief notes must be recorded on Charitylog following each session
- Full counselling notes must be kept by the counsellor in line with BACP and GDPR regulations

 Evidence of regular clinical supervision in line with BACP guidelines is a requirement of the charity. The charity will source and pay for regular online group supervision. Should you wish to attend individual supervision, this would be paid for independently by the counsellor.
