We rarely get 10-year anniversaries cropping up, but we've got two to tell you about for July! How lucky is the charity to have two wonderful volunteers who have been with us for this length of time.

During the time she had cared for him, Kate realised the loneliness that vulnerable older people can experience and wanted to help reduce the sense of isolation and anxiety of an older person by visiting and passing on useful information about services as needs arose. This led her to volunteer as a volunteer visitor in our old befriending service which then led to telephone befriending as she started to move around a lot. Kate has developed many new and wonderful friendships through her volunteering. She says that:

WALKING FOR HEALTH ON CARLTON HILL

Did you know we offer a new walk on Carlton Hill?

Meeting at Carlton Hill Recreation ground this walk will consist of a short walk around the recreation ground and then down to The Hope Community Hub for refreshments it will take 30 to 40 minutes depending on the mobility of the walkers. There is a local bus that returns to the car park if you don't want to walk up the hill. It's a varied walk mostly on pavements and paths and may include grassed areas.

Walks are held at 11am the final Tuesday of each month:

The next weeks are: 27th August, 24th September, 29th October & 26th November.

Walking is such a wonderful way of improving overall fitness, topping up your vitamin D levels (so important for bone health) in the sunshine and creating opportunities to make new friends and socialise.






13th August : International Left Handers Day
