ELECTION DEADLINES



Voter registration – 11.59pm 18th June

Voting if you live abroad – 11.59pm 18th June

Applying for a postal vote – 5pm 19th June (especially important if you are away on holiday on July 4th)

Applying for a proxy vote – 5pm 26th June (if you need someone to vote on your behalf because you can't go to the polling station)

Obtaining voter photo ID – 5pm 26th June (if you don't have anything on the approved list)

Polling Day – make sure you have your Voter ID (and, preferably) your Polling Card when you go to your designated polling station to cast your vote for your chosen candidate

- 1. Keep the pensions triple lock
- 2. An accessible NHS with lower waiting lists and easy to access GP services
- 3. Reforming social care and being able to access essential services (especially when everything is going online)
- 4. Ensuring the voices of older people are heard by government
- 5. Getting to grips with an ageing population
