Don't miss out on the Winter Fuel Payment



You may have heard that there have to the eligibility criteria to qualify for the Winter Fuel Paymo This means that now, in order to qualify for

the payment, people need to be in receipt of Pension Credit. It is estimated that over 800,000 people who are entitled to the benefit are not claiming it, meaning they miss out on other benefits and support.

We are therefore strongly recommending that older Solihull residents get a **benefits check** to see if they are eligible for Pension Credit, or other benefits which may entitle them to the Winter Fuel Payment.

The deadline to apply for the Winter Fuel Payment is **21 December**, so residents should apply for recently been changes Pension Credit before then.

> We are holding several **Pension Credit Events** where we will offer **benefits checks** and **support** with applications. The events will take place from 1.30-4.00pm on the Lower Ground Floor of The Core, Solihull, on 11, 12, 14, 15, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 November, and 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 December.

To **book** onto one of the events, or if you have any worries about **keeping warm** this winter, please call our Winter Warmth line on 0121 704 8080. This service is primarily aimed at **older people**, those living with **disabilities** or **long-term health** conditions, carers, and families with young children. We are **here to help**.

Hazel's story



"If it was not for a neighbour. I would still be struggling to regain my freedom. About ten years ago I tried to get a <mark>Blue Badge</mark>, but was rejected. Now thanks to Age UK Solihull, I no park outside the shops.

I injured my back as a child and developed severe scoliosis. I spent 18 months in hospital and needed a major operation taking bone from my leg to graft into my spine. If anyone told me I could not do anything, I went out of my way to achieve it. I have been skiing, hill climbing, and, most importantly, I worked! It was something I was told I never would be able to do. As a journalist there was not much sitting still so it suited me fine. Now at 76, my right leg from which the bone graft was taken drags, and because my back is basically one solid bone I do not have much counter balance so I sometimes fall.

Thanks to my neighbour's suggestion I contacted Age UK Solihull about a Blue Badge. I am too independent to admit to my failing abilities, but the kindness and professionalism of advisers, who not only filled out my form for the Blue Badge, but also suggested I apply for Attendance Allowance, was amazing. They gently got me suffer alone. Contact our Older People's to admit to my limitations.

advisers have changed my life. Their suggestions were never intrusive, but supportive with one aim in mind – to help to make my life easier. A life which has been difficult since my husband's death five years ago.

Can you imagine someone smiling because the stairs longer go home empty handed as I can have been vacuumed cleaned!! That small thing which might seem insignificant is amazing to me and it is all thanks to Age UK Solihull. I never thought I would need Age UK, after all I am an independent, professional person who has navigated the minefield that is life, but this organisation is so special and its people offer outstanding help and support.

> I have learned my lesson – there is little point in struggling if you can ask for help, especially if it is from Age UK Solihull. I have promised my neighbour an afternoon out at a garden centre with cream tea as a thank you and I will be parking right outside the front door!

PSI turns 10!

We recently celebrated the 10 year anniversary of The classes receive so much positive feedback running our hugely successful **Postural Stability** Instruction (PSI) project.



Funded by **Birmingh** Ind Solihull ICS, PSI is the only evidencebased exercise that provides **proven** outcomes for frequent or recurrent fallers.

Our first PSI class started in July 2014. Since then, we have been able to offer over **1,630** people in Solihull a **free place** on these 20-week exercise programmes.

A significant benefit of the programme is that we offer **free transport** to clients attending the weekly exercise classes. This is possible due to having an amazing support team of over 40 PSI volunteers, who either drive clients to and from the PSI classes or offer support in the classes themselves.
