A delightful journey through nature and spirits! This event has been planned for a Sunday for those Volunteers who work during the week.

I'm excited to invite you to join us on a leisurely walk across beautiful Broomfield Hill, as we follow in the footsteps of Dryad Gin distiller, Becky Wright

Together, we will explore the mesmerising diversity of flowers, trees, and plants that perfectly complement the creation of gin. We'll even connect with the enchanting tree spirits and discover the captivating tale behind Dryad Gin while paying a visit to The Dryad Tree, the muse that inspired this exceptional spirit. And that's not all! You'll have the chance to savor the exquisite Dryad Gin and partake in the traditional blackbirds beak toast.

No dogs please (cattle nearby).

About Dryad Gin - Dryad Gin is a unique, small-batch Somerset gin made with majestic oak trees and distilled in traditional copper stills from the foothills of the Quantocks. Dryad Gin is evocative of sundrenched afternoons in the company of firm friends, infused with fragrant notes of cardamom, cinnamon, orange peel and almond for a deliciously quaffable tipple rooted in natural mythology.

Becky Wright, the artisan behind Dryad Gin, she is part of the local community spirit, fostering connections and presides over a Pop Up Pub on The Quantocks known as The Dryad Inn.

Self-guided tour of Shepton Mallet Prison

Frithfield Lane, Shepton Mallet, Somerset, BA4 5FQ

The team that run Shepton Mallet Prison are kindly letting a group of us explore "behind bars" in this self-guided tour. Shepton Mallet Prison, often referred to as Cornhill or The Mallet, housed its first inmates in 1625. The prison closed in 1930 only to be used again as a Military prison during WWII. We will soak up the atmosphere of this amazing 400-year-old building where features of the original 1600s prison can still be seen in the Old Gate Lodge as well as the Governor's office. We can visit the cells, exercise yard, kitchens and even the execution room if we have the stomach for it.
