CONNECTION AND CREATION - MEN IN SHEDS

Retirement is something people often look forward to but when it does come, it can sometimes give people a sense of loss and lack of purpose. Men in Sheds can help change that.

Jim stopped working at the age of 74 and then sat at home bored and didn't know what to do. He even said to his partner, who was still working, that he felt as if he was buried alive!

"I wasn't going anywhere or doing anything because when you're at work you have your friends and at weekends you go out with them, or you go shopping or do whatever you do.

I found out about Men in Sheds moving into Merrist Wood and I thought I'd go for that because I wasn't doing anything - and it was the best thing I've done. I came here and I've met some blokes and we've been out on some outings. I enjoy coming here, it breaks the week up and I learn quite a bit.

Before retiring, I worked on the buildings, and I used to carve wood in my spare time so when I was told that Age UK Surrey had a woodworking project, I went for that. It was very strange coming here for the first time as I was stuck indoors not doing anything, but I settled in quite quickly and we have a good laugh and a joke.

You work all your life and you're dealing with people, I was a supervisor, and then suddenly after retirement it shuts off and you've got nothing to do. You can't play golf because other people are at work and there's not much to do especially in the winter. I'm glad I came here; I've made some friends. It's good to get out of the house and it saves doing the housework!! It's a good outlet for me. I could be sitting at home just doing nothing! I'm glad to get out of the house and I look forward to it. It feels like you've done something, you've been out and met people, and it breaks up the week - it's good. I suppose as you get older things change. It's being able to talk to people and mixing which is a good outlet here at the Shed – I'm really glad I came along."



Connection, conversation and creation – that's what Men in Sheds located in Merrist Wood College is all about. It encourages both men and women to come together to make, repair and repurpose, supporting projects in the community.

40 years of Volunteers' Week 2024 was celebrated in the first week of June throughout the UK. Volunteers make an incredible impact every single day in Age UK Surrey and we are so grateful for all that they do.

Bob said he was 'volunteered' by Pauline his wife (pictured here and also an Age UK Surrey Volunteer) and he didn't really want to do it as he was still working! "I decided to make a suggestion to the Volunteer Coordinator that I thought they wouldn't possibly fill. I told her that I wanted to visit an ex-military man as I'm exmilitary, someone who swears and drinks a lot. I thought they won't have anyone like that, but the Volunteer Co-ordinator said I've got just the person for you!

My client was a character; he was in Burma in World War II and had many war stories. I used to think Befriending was just to sit there and talk but I slowly realised that it actually meant 'be a friend' not just a visitor. I was quite choked up when he passed away and didn't want to do it anymore, but I was persuaded to carry on and was matched with another.

I went to visit him one day and when one of his carers came in, he introduced me as "this is my friend Bob", not as this is my Age UK Surrey visitor and I felt "Yeah, that's what it's all about"! I think you know when you get a good conversation going with someone because it's



like a game of ping-pong. You serve and it comes back. We put the world to rights as men do and it's great."

"When you walk in and they look up and smile and you've battled through traffic, wind, and rain, you know it's worth it. It's very rewarding."

IMPROVING OLDER PEOPLE'S WELLBEING

Household Support Fund

The government has issued financial support called the Household Support Fund which has been made available locally through Surrey County Council and selected organisations, of which Age UK Surrey is one. The fund is available to apply to until 30th September and gives direct financial support to pay gas, water and/or electricity bills potentially including arrears. The value of any individual funding award will be dependent upon individual circumstances.



Eligibility for the fund includes pensioners, families with children on low incomes and single householders on fixed incomes. Age UK Surrey has an allocation, while funds last, to support eligible pensioners. To find out if you are eligible and to receive support with applying to Age UK Surrey please contact us. Please have on hand your utility bill(s), estimated weekly income and household expenditure for eg, food/tel/mortgage or rent.

Tech Support

Need digital help with your computer, tablet or mobile phone? Our team of friendly and experienced Tech Support volunteers are just a phone call away. Free support is given for tasks you want to do; whether that be video calling family or friends, online shopping or pursuing your hobbies & interests, we are here to help.



We also have a Tech Support Centre in Guildford. Sessions by appointment only, **Monday to Friday**, **10.00am - 12.00pm**. Drop-in sessions are available at The Clockhouse (Milford) **Mondays 10.00am - 12.00pm**.

Help at Home

Our Help at Home service is here to make your life easier for you - whether you need someone to keep your home clean and hygienic, do light housework, have a chat, go to the shops or tidy your garden. We provide a personal and tailored service.

Lasting Power of Attorney

We offer a full Lasting Power of Attorney service to Surrey residents aged fifty and over. Our Co-ordinator will take you through the LPA process step by step during a face-to-face meeting and ensure all paperwork is submitted correctly to the Office of the Public Guardian. A fee applies.
