To support individuals living with dementia and their carers, by delivery of group activities e.g. carer support, dementia activity groups & Maintenance Cognitive Stimulation Therapy (MCST)

- To plan and organise dementia activity groups in community locations
- To deliver the MCST programme in community locations
- To establish and run carer support groups in community locations
- Connecting and developing a community network of partners to assist in facilitating groups
- Work with volunteers to ensure the smooth running of group sessions
- Taking payment for sessions and maintaining records of transaction
