<u>Chair's Report</u>



I would like to thank all our funders, staff, volunteers, partners, and Board of Trustees who supported us to deliver services and contributed to the ongoing success of Age UK Wigan Borough.

April 2023 saw the publication of our new 2023-2026 Strategic Plan, drafted with input from our staff, volunteers and customers, drawing on direct feedback to inform our future direction. Our new strategy will guide us for the next three years as a live document, which we will review each year and identify our priorities through our annual business plan.

Everyone in the Age UK Wigan Borough team will continue to empower, strive for excellence, and innovate to provide first class services to support older people right across our Borough.

We continue to be in a sound financial position and are well placed to be able to respond to, and meet, the changing needs of local older adults. In tandem with ongoing service reviews, we have engaged in new and innovative projects, in partnership and collaboration with our local health and care partners, and the wider voluntary sector, to facilitate more personalised support, improving health and wellbeing outcomes and doing our bit to reduce the health inequalities experienced by many in the Borough.

Our Board of Trustees was also proactive in recognising the cost-of-living crisis which saw high energy bills and high inflation impacting our staff, volunteers and customers. We embarked upon a period of meaningful workforce and service development, with the implementation of a new training, opportunities for internal progress and enlisting the expertise of others to deliver training. We have prioritised staff wellbeing and support, investing in a programme of health benefits for staff, which includes an Employee Assistance Programme, a whole host of savings and cash back on medical treatments.

Teamwork was a key strength that carried us through the pressures of increased demand for services throughout the year. Our accredited Information and Advice, effectively meet customers' needs and got the right financial support in place to improve life outcomes. We successfully passed our Charity Quality Standard external assessment, cementing our approach to continuous improvement and dedication to the provision of quality services for our customers.

Whilst we have outlined Age UK Wigan Borough's trajectory, we know that the environment we operate in continues to be volatile and unpredictable, so we will continue to be agile and proactive in our approach to best place ourselves to respond to both positive opportunities and negative external variables that come our way.

Our Mission Statement

We improve the quality of life for local people aged 50 and over. We provide services to ensure people have the information they need to live their lives as they choose, can live safely in their own homes and combat loneliness and isolation. We make sure the voices of local people are heard and can influence improvement to local services.



During 2023-24 we supported nearly 5000 people and their households aged 50 plus. This was an increase of 13% on the previous year.

What We Do Support at Home

Our Support at Home services have continued growing to provide valuable help to older people in their homes. We have three full-time Handypersons who assist with small jobs, providing a high-quality and competitively priced service, and allowing people to live comfortably and safely in their homes.

Our Home Help team support people with everyday tasks to help them remain independent, provide companionship and reduce isolation across Wigan Borough. We have now expanded to a team to more than 30 Home Helpers.

Information and Advice

Benefits

During 2023-24 we helped 1692 people to gain an additional £2,824,229 in unclaimed benefits.



This was a 31% increase from the previous year.

We successfully highlighted our milestone of securing over £2.8 million in unclaimed benefits by sharing the news with local media. This increased awareness about benefit entitlements and showcased the significant impact our information and advice service has on the community.

Bright Days Activities

We provide a weekly programme with of engaging activities across Wigan Borough. Our goal is to combat isolation, enhance well-being, and strengthen the Borough's community.

we had a steady rise in attendance numbers, averaging between **750** and **800** per month by March 2024.

Our Silver Choir is our most popular group, drawing in 40-50 members each week. They are led by our choirmaster from the Wigan Music Service and sing a range of musical styles. Throughout the past year, the choir has held concerts and performances within our local community.

Ensuring the voices of people aged 50 and over are heard!

Our 'Have Your Say' group empowers individuals aged 50 and over in the Borough to share their opinions, ensuring their voices are valued and contribute to enhancing services. The group has expanded to 51 participants who actively engage in various surveys and consultations, influencing local, regional, and national services.

Our Impact during 2023/24

Support at Home

of our customers felt it 73.3% was easier to manage around the home due to around the home due to our Home Help Service.

of our customers felt safer 73.3% at home due to our Handyperson Service.

99% would rate our Support at Home Service as excellent or very good.

Information and Advice

76% of our Information and Advice clients would not know where to go if our service was not available.



How our clients spent their benefit entitlement:

- 50% said they spent at least some of it on additional heating.
- 59% said they spent at least some of it on practical help in the home.
- 45% said they spent at least some of it on food.
- 43% said they spent at least some of it on household repairs / decoration.
- 18% said they spent at least some of it on household equipment.



Sustainability


We have increased our unrestricted income and donations over the past year. Through a combination of community engagement and strategic partnerships, we have effectively raised awareness of the charity's funding needs.

Our team have taken part in local fundraising events such as the Wigan 10K, Standish Christmas Markets, and a Sponsored Walk. Our sponsored walk will be an annual opportunity for our supporters to get involved.

Events

Throughout 2023-24, we celebrated various events, including the Coronation of King Charles III, International Day of Older Persons, and Carers Week.

We hosted promotional stalls at various events such as the Wigan Rotary and the WWL Foundation's Continuous Improvement Conference.

We also collaborated with Wigan Council's Welfare Team and Citizens Advice Wigan Borough to support local people during the cost of living crisis by highlighting free benefit check services.










Financial Matters

We continued to be in a sound financial position in the year ending 31 March 2024. Our total income of £917,766 represents an increase of £245,125 (26.7%) against the previous financial year's position. Of the £917,766 income, £339,872 (37%) came from trading activities as shown in the chart below.

Staff and Volunteers

In 2023-24, we had an average of 52 staff members. We focussed on staff development by providing training for our staff from external organisations. Additionally, we prioritised staff welfare and support by investing in the health benefit programme Medicash which features an Employee Assistance Programme and extensive savings and cashback options for medical treatments.

We saw an increase to 34 volunteers, up by 12 from the previous year. Some of our volunteers this year participated in fundraising and promotional events to let residents know about our services. During Volunteers' Week, we expressed our gratitude by presenting our volunteers with goodie bags containing a charm that said 'You're an essential part of our team'.






