Training

Our management team participated in valuable training sessions on equality, diversity, and inclusion, led by Farai from Everything Human Rights. We covered essential topics such as legal definitions, responsibilities, and perspectives specific to Wigan. The training focused on practical steps for implementation, including addressing bullying, harassment and inappropriate banter, understanding unconscious bias, and fostering alliances.

Earlier on in the year, we also received training from the George House Trust on HIV awareness and understanding. We learned about HIV transmission routes, attitudes towards HIV, improving our services for people living with HIV and the latest developments in HIV.

Our Services


Support at Home

Our paid for Home Help and Handyperson services specialise in everyday tasks, assisting people to live safely and independently in their home.

Handyperson

Between April 2023 - April 2024, we completed 2707 handyperson jobs in people's homes!

Our Handyperson service gets excellent feedback. One client commented "I liked the fact that a name was given for the handy person, uniform was worn, and they had an ID badge. It made me feel safer, as I am on my own."



Home Help

Between April 2023 - April 2024, we provided over 18,318 hours of help through our Home Help Service!

Our Home Help service also gets excellent feedback. One client said "She's become a part of the family. She cheers us up. It's working really well."

Information & Advice

Our free service provides information and advice about a wide range of topics such as Pension Credit and Attendance Allowance or practical guidance like filling out applications for a blue badge.

This financial year, our Information and Advice team have already helped households across Wigan Borough claim over £1.9 million*.

If you are aged 50+ and live in the Wigan Borough we want to make sure you are getting the benefits you are entitled too. An estimated 4,376 pensioners in Wigan are missing out on Pension Credit, resulting in nearly £9 million in unclaimed funds annually. We offer a free information and specialist welfare benefit advice service, helping you maximize your income and access essential support.

Last year, we helped clients claim over £2.8 million in benefits. One client says "I would like to say the difference Age UK Wigan Borough has made to my life is life-changing. The dedication, time, and support I received over these past few months will make a difference. I was in a very dark place, not knowing where to turn before I contacted Age UK Wigan Borough."

Steps to Success

Our free and new Steps to Success programme engages individuals aged 50 and over in local activities and hobbies, providing opportunities to forge new friendships and strengthen community ties. Our team works closely with individuals helping them over a six-week journey to help them feel more positive, confident and more active as well as reducing social isolation and loneliness.

Mel's Story

When we first met Mel, she recently moved into sheltered accommodation in a new area and was not going out much. She joined the Steps to Success programme to help get her out and about and become more sociable.

Mel met with Nicolle, Steps to Success Support Worker, to discuss what activities she would like to try. Nicolle supported Mel by attending a social group together.

Mel said "it really helps with confidence and meeting people".

Since completing the programme, Mel has taken the initiative to explore new groups on her own and has become more engaged in various activities.
